GET INVOLVED WITH GEAR UP!

Aggie Homework Helpline (AHH)

AHH is offered to all GEAR UP students including recurring and on-demand tutoring via Zoom.

Mentoring

One-to-one mentors are paired with students to help keep them on track towards graduation.

College Visits / Educational Field Trips

Increase student awareness and exposures to post-high-school options including college visits, college fairs, and educational experiences.

College Readiness / Career Activities

Activities take place throughout the year to prepare students for after high school by increasing self-advocacy, self-determination, financial literacy, college knowledge, and goal setting.

Work-Based Learning

Students have the opportunity to gain valuable work skills through: volunteerism, job shadowing, internships, etc.

Counseling and Advising

GEAR UP staff is on campus to offer counseling and advising to all GEAR UP students throughout the year.







SUMMER PROGRAMMING

HISD & BISD Summer School

GEAR UP offers activities during summer school to help students learn about their strengths, interests, and increase skills to promote success.

St. Joseph's Volunteering

2-month long volunteering program that provides the opportunity for students to explore various medical career opportunities and shadow several medical professionals.

BVCIL Summer Camp

Week-long camp offered to Special Education GEAR UP students in BISD that focuses on future planning, independent living skills, self-advocacy, financial literacy, etc.

High School Camps

In 2023, as students are transitioning to the new school year, GEAR UP will participate in programmed high school back-to-school events for all students.

Additional Summer Camps

GEAR UP gives the opportunity to students to attend YAP camp at Texas A&M, participate in the Boys and Girls Club Camp, and Aggie STEM Camp.









PARENTS CORNER

High school is a time in which teens are establishing their individuality. It is important that parents teach independence and responsibility to their children. We encourage you to spend some time talking about their future goals and aspirations. Being open and understanding are traits that will not go unnoticed by your child and which will increase their selfconfidence. In addition to these conversations, it is important that you foster a safe space in which they can feel free to make mistakes and fail, but always get up and try again.

FINANCIAL LITERACY

As students transition further into high school, financial literacy continues to be an essential part of their growth. Some students might be starting jobs within the next year therefore, it is important they understand the different types of accounts they can choose from, how to open, and how to use it properly.

Saving & Checking Accounts

Checking Accounts: Money that can be easily accessed for every day needs. These accounts often come with debit cards, checks, etc.

Savings Accounts: Money saved for long-term needs and goals. This money accrues interests and grows over time. Money has limited access.

FAFSA

WHAT IS IT?

FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid.

WHAT IS ITS MAIN PURPOSE?

FAFSA calculates the EFC (Expected Family Contribution). The EFC is an estimate on how much your family is expected to be able to pay for college. Based off the EFC, FAFSA offers different types of aid to help bridge the gap in paying for college.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF AIDS

- Grants: Free money given based on financial need.
- Loans (Subsidized & Unsubsidized): Money that you must pay back. Unsubsidized loans accrue interests.
- Scholarships: Money usually given based on academic achievement.

Applying for college can be a stressful process but thinking about how you will afford it can sometimes be even more concerning. This is why it is important to be informed about the financial student aid options available.

WHERE TO APPLY?

You can create a profile and fill out your FAFSA by going to studentaid.gov

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I HAVE FILLED OUT THE APPLICATION?

Your information will be reviewed and sent out to the colleges/universities you listed on the form. You will then receive an aid offer from these schools.

TIP: Compare the offers before deciding where to attend!




